



Welcome to Lime Cycle

Transforming food waste into something beautiful. One pickup at a time.

Lime Cycle is a community-based compost collection service designed for urban and suburban households. We make it easy to keep your kitchen scraps out of landfill, where they would produce methane, and instead send them to local partner farms to feed the soil.

We deliver specially designed, odour-controlled compost bags straight to your door. On scheduled collection days, our team will collect your full bag and replace it with a fresh one.

No mess, no smell, no hassle.

Lime Cycle was founded on the simple idea that most people want to compost, but life gets in the way. Apartments have no outdoor bins. Rental properties have rules. Even homeowners with green bins often find the process messy or inconsistent.

We created Lime Cycle to solve all these problems. By combining smart bag technology with a reliable collection service, we remove all barriers to responsible food waste management.

To build sustainable urban ecosystems by making composting as easy as recycling — for everyone, regardless of where they live.

[Vision](#)

We envisage a future in which no household food waste ends up in landfill and every suburban neighbourhood participates in a closed-loop system that feeds local soils and tables. Lime Cycle's long-term goal is to become the default composting infrastructure for cities across the country. We will achieve this by partnering with municipalities, housing cooperatives, schools and businesses to create a truly circular urban food system. Within five years, we aim to divert over one million kilograms of food waste annually and supply finished compost to over 50 partner farms.

We work with local farms, households and volunteers. The fewer steps there are to composting, the more people will do it. We openly publish our diversion numbers, farm partnerships and impact data. Composting should not be a premium service reserved for affluent neighbourhoods.

How We Are Different

Contrary to local green bin schemes, which can be unreliable, usually limited to detached residences, and provide no indication of where your biodegradable rubbish is sent. Lime Cycle is a private, subscription-based service with a direct farm-to-table feedback loop. You know exactly which farms receive your compost, and you receive seasonal updates on the crops it has helped to grow.

Compared to community composting drop-off sites, Lime Cycle also eliminates the need to store and transport waste yourself. Our collection service comes to your door on a predictable schedule and does not require a car or outdoor storage space.

Other companies use biodegradable bags that are only used once and cost more and are not good for the environment. Our reusable-compatible odour-managing bag system is designed for long-term affordability and lower packaging waste.

Where We Operate

Lime Cycle currently serves select suburban neighbourhoods in the greater urban area. We are actively expanding our collection zones. Enter your postcode on the Contact page to check if we operate in your area.

How People Find Us

Most of our new members hear about Lime Cycle through word of mouth from neighbours and friends. The easiest way to spread the message is to leave a compost bag on someone's doorstep. We also distribute flyers in building lobbies, community centres and at local farmers' markets. Online, we maintain active Instagram and Facebook communities, sharing farm updates, composting tips and workshop announcements. Services

How Lime Cycle Works

Lime Cycle is a subscription service, not a store. Once you have signed up, everything else is handled for you. Here is what the process looks like from start to finish.

Step 1 - Check Your Zone

Enter your postcode on our Contact and Support page to confirm that your address falls within one of our active collection zones. If you are not yet in a covered area, you can join our waiting list and we will notify you when the service launches in your neighbourhood.

Step 2 - Choose Your Plan

Select the Starter, Family or Plus plan based on the size of your household and how much you cook at home. Not sure which to choose? The Family plan is suitable for most households of two to four people. You can change your plan once per year at no charge.

Step 3 - Apply Online

Complete the membership form on our Contact and Support page, providing your name, address and chosen plan. No payment is required online — we will confirm your zone and contact you within one business day to arrange your first delivery and confirm billing.

Step 4 - Receive Your Starter Kit

A few days after your confirmation call, we will deliver your starter kit, which includes your first set of compost bags, a compact kitchen caddy and a quick-start guide. Your recurring pickup day will be included in your welcome email.

Step 5 - Fill Your Bag

Throughout the week, add your kitchen scraps, such as fruit and vegetable peels, coffee grounds, eggshells, bread, pasta, dairy products and small amounts of cooked food. The bag is lined with an odour-managing layer that keeps your kitchen smelling fresh.

Step 6 - Set It Out on Pickup Day

On your designated pickup day, place your filled bag at your building entrance or on your front step. Our team will pick it up and leave a fresh bag in its place. From that point on, the cycle repeats automatically every week — no action is needed on your part unless your bag is not full.

You do not need to make a purchase on this website. All we ask is that you check if your area is covered, read about our plans and submit a membership application via the Contact and Support form. This is the first step towards hassle-free composting. If you have any questions, please get in touch. We respond within one business day.

More About Our Service

Lime Cycle operates a zone-based collection schedule. Each zone is serviced on the same day each week (e.g. Zone A is serviced every Tuesday). Your zone and collection day will be confirmed when you enrol.

What We Accept

- Fruit and vegetable scraps
- Coffee grounds and paper filters
- Tea bags (paper only)
- Eggshells
- Bread, grains, pasta, and rice
- Dairy products in small amounts
- Cooked food scraps (no large bones)

What We Do NOT Accept

- Large animal bones
- Liquids (please ensure drain wet scraps are dried before bagging)
- Non-compostable packaging or plastic
- Pet waste

Collected compost is processed at partner facilities and delivered as finished compost to farms in our network. Members receive annual updates on how their household's compost contributes to local food production.

Making a Big Difference

Every compost bag that is diverted from landfill represents a small victory. When this is multiplied by the number of households over a period of months or years, the impact becomes significant. This page showcases our collective achievements and our future goals.

- Over 12,000 kg of food waste diverted from landfill
- Compost delivered to 6 partner farms
- Estimated reduction of 4.8 tonnes of CO₂-equivalent methane
- Serving 850+ active member households

These figures are updated quarterly. We publish our full impact report each spring.

Why Composting Matters for the Environment

When food waste ends up in landfill, it breaks down without oxygen in a process that generates methane, a greenhouse gas that is roughly 25 times more potent than CO₂ over a 100-year period. In Canada, organic waste accounts for a significant proportion of municipal solid waste and is a major source of landfill methane emissions.

Composting transforms that waste into a resource. Finished compost improves soil structure, reduces the need for synthetic fertilisers, increases water retention in agricultural soils and supports biodiversity.

By composting with Lime Cycle, you are doing more than just keeping waste out of landfill. You are actively contributing to a regenerative food system that feeds back into local agriculture.

Does the compost bag smell?

Our bags have a special inner lining that traps and neutralises odours from food scraps at room temperature. Most members keep the bag on their countertop or under their sink without experiencing any unpleasant smells. Keeping the bag sealed between uses and avoiding adding large quantities of hot liquids will help to prevent any odours.

How often is pickup?

Pickup is once per week on your assigned zone day. You can view your zone's collection day in your member dashboard. We do not currently offer on-demand pickups, but this is on our roadmap.

Can I compost meat and dairy?

Yes, in moderate amounts. Our collection and processing system is designed to handle a broader range of organic material than a typical backyard composter. Please avoid placing large amounts of raw meat or fish in the bag and always drain excess liquid.

What if my bag isn't collected on pickup day?

Missed collections are rare, but if your bag was left behind, please report it via your member dashboard or contact our support team within 24 hours. We will then arrange either a next-day collection or a credit to your account.

How do I cancel my membership?

You can cancel at any time with 14 days' notice via your member dashboard. There are no cancellation fees. If you cancel partway through a billing cycle, you will receive a prorated credit.

Is this service available in my area?

We currently serve select zones and are expanding regularly. Visit our Contact and Support page and enter your postcode to check availability.

Can I use this service in an apartment?

Absolutely. In fact, apartments are one of our main target markets. You don't need a yard or an outdoor bin. Simply place your bag at your building's designated collection spot on collection day. Contact us to confirm that your building is in our collection zone.

Do you run workshops or educational events?

Yes, we are! We occasionally host online workshops on home composting, sustainable cooking and reducing food waste. Members are notified of upcoming workshops by email. Follow us on social media to stay up to date with our public events.
